


Lesson 7: Kings





Role

- Judge (1 Sam 7:2-4)
- Also a prophet (1 Sam 3:20)
- Also a priest (1 Sam 7:9)


Last of the Judges

- Sort of...Samuel appointed his sons as judges but the people rejected them because they were evil (8:1,3)
- Give us a king (8:4-8)
- People warned about life under a king

Saul Anointed King

- Saul's errors
 - Unlawful sacrifice (13)
 - Rebellion regarding Amalek (15)
 - Rejection by God (15:22-23, 35)

David Anointed King


- Selection by God (16:1, 12-13)
- Not officially king until 2 Sam 2
- Several years of oppression by Saul
- Begins reign upon Saul's death, reigns 40 years

David's Accomplishments

- Unites Israel after Saul's tumultuous reign
- Conquers Jerusalem; moves ark to Jerusalem; makes Jerusalem the capital
- Israel's enemies driven out; Israel given rest (2 Sam 7:1)




- Building David's house (2 Sam 7:2-3, 11b-16)


United Kingdom

- Saul (40 year reign)
- David (40 year reign)
- Solomon (40 year reign)
 - Asked for wisdom to rule well
 - Became extremely wealthy
 - Wealth and power began to corrupt
 - Married wives from idolatrous nations, built temples for their gods
 - Penalty: 1 Kings 11:29-35

"And he did evil in the sight of the LORD, according to the abominations of the nations whom the LORD had cast out before the children of Israel.


For he rebuilt the high places which Hezekiah his father had destroyed; he raised up altars for Baal, and made a wooden image, as Ahab king of Israel had done; and he worshiped all the host of heaven and served them.


He also built altars in the house of the LORD, of which the LORD had said, "In Jerusalem I will put My name." And he built altars for all the host of heaven in the two courts of the house of the LORD.

He even set a carved image of Asherah that he had made, in the house of which the LORD had said to David and to Solomon his son, "In this house and in Jerusalem, which I have chosen out of all the tribes of Israel, I will put My name forever; and I will not make the feet of Israel wander anymore from the land which I gave their fathers-only if they are careful to do according to all that I have commanded them, and according to all the law that My servant Moses commanded them."

But they paid no attention, and Manasseh seduced them to do more evil than the nations whom the LORD had destroyed before the children of Israel."


KINGDOM DIVIDES [922 BC]








Prophets


- Non-literary

 - Habakkuk




Prophets


- Purpose of the prophets

 - About the consequences of their actions
 - About penalties for disobedience
 - Provides glimpses of God's great plan through Christ (1 Peter 1:10-12)

Kings and Prophets of Israel and Judah (modified 3/4/2011)








Final Days


- Demise of Israel
